DINGHY DOCK, YES! AT LAST — The pleas of our many good friends that ride the hook while visiting with us will soon be answered with the pending installation of a 40 foot by 8 foot aluminum dinghy dock and 20-foot aluminum access ramp. The new floating dock addition will be positioned on the waterfront by the marina administration building. With the ramp access, our visitors will even be able to take the dock carts directly down the ramp to load provisions, etc. directly into their dinks. It is expected the dock installation will be completed before November (2010 of course!). Prior to the new dinghy dock, visitors had to bring their dinghies to the main dock and have to get up some four feet to the top of the dock to get off their boats. The dock will be low profile to facilitate loading and unloading and have ample cleats so visitors can lock their dinghies to the dock if desired..
