<u>HAITI RELIEF YACHTS CALL</u> – In recent weeks, we've had the pleasure of making many friends from those yachts which have been carrying relief goods and medical assistance to many of the tiny Haitian ports which are not accessible to large commercial vessels. This effort has been coordinated largely by Oceans Watch. As this issue of Docklines went to press, another flotilla was expected to arrive in Port Antonio after calling at their assigned ports in Haiti. It has been reported by several of the yachts that many of these remote locations reported their recent visit was the first relief their area had seen since the earthquake struck. We salute the efforts of these volunteer sailors and urge our readers to continue to support the Haiti relief effort.

<u>VIVE LA FRANCE!</u> We are pleased to have been selected to again host the Transcaraibes Rally 2010 again April 15-17. The annual rally consists of 10-15 yachts mostly from the Eastern Caribbean department of Guadeloupe. The group stops in French St. Martin and the Dominican Republic enroute to Jamaica before their finale leg to Cienfuegos, Cuba.

<u>"KNIGHT AND DAY" FILMED HERE -</u> We recently said goodbye to Tom Cruise and Cameron Diaz and crew who filmed the final scenes from their action thriller "Knight and Day" at nearby Frenchman's Cove. Our resident dive boat, "Lady G Diver" served as the main camera boat. This was Tom Cruise' second film in Port Antonio. <u>CRUISE SHIPS VISIT</u> - In addition to our marina facilities, Port Antonio is also a regular cruise ship port of call for a number of "boutique size vessels" These are vessels under 660 feet in length and usually carrying less than 600 passengers. Recent visitors have included the Sea Cloud II and the Club Med II. On March 16 we will host our final cruise ship of the season, "M/S Deutschland, an unusual modern day cruise ship built to emanate the opulence of the 1920's The small cruise ships that call at Port Antonio have a reputation for an unparalleled level of service, often having a crew-passenger ratio of almost one to one.

JAMAICA ENTRY AMONG CLIPPER LEADERS- "Jamaica Lightning Bolt" is among the serious contenders in the early legs of the Clipper Round the World race. Following their hero's welcome and an unforgettable stopover in the Shandong provincial city of Qingdao, China, Jamaica Lightning Bolt, one of ten teams competing in the Clipper 09-10 Round the World Yacht Race, was treated to a spectacular send off for Race 7 of the 35,000-mile global challenge to San Francisco. As the brave sailors manned their boat and prepared to do battle with the largest ocean on the planet, thousands lined the breakwater of the Olympic Sailing Centre to send them on their way. A 15-knot breeze from the north gave a gentle introduction to the 5,680-mile race to California, USA, the longest leg in the history of the Clipper Race. Before them lie thousands of miles of Pacific Ocean and speaking ahead of the start, skipper of Jamaica Lightning Bolt, Pete Stirling, shared his thoughts on the race ahead.

We've had a few podiums, three thirds and now a second, and we've really enjoyed being on the podium and would like to stay there. This next one is the longest race in the whole round the world race and it's potentially going to be quite tough, very cold but with some good strong following winds. It's an endurance test really and the key thing is to look after the crew and the boat. We need to get across the other side in one piece. To finish first, first you have to finish," he added." Joining *Jamaica Lightning Bolt* for the Pacific leg is *Cork* crew member, Conor Murphy, who is racing on board the Caribbean entry following *Cork*'s grounding in Race 6. The ten yacht racing fleet is expected to visit Port Antonio on or about May 15 for a four day layover. The actual arrival date is contingent on the Pacific cossing time, plus any delays that may be encountered transiting the Panama Canal. This will be their third visit to Jamaica. When the fleet departs Jamaica, they will be heading to New York and thence to Liverpool.
